

**Controller's Information – pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 (hereinafter: GDPR)**

1. The controller of your personal data is Białystok University of Technology, ul. Wiejska 45A, 15-351 Białystok, Poland, tel.: +48 85 746 90 00, <https://www.pb.edu.pl> (hereinafter: the University).
2. In accordance with Article 37(1)(a) of the GDPR, the Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer, whom you may contact regarding matters related to the processing of personal data via email at: [iod@pb.edu.pl](mailto:iod@pb.edu.pl).
3. Your personal data will be processed for the following purposes:
  - 1) registration of participation and organization of the conference “9th German-Polish Conference on Optimization Methods and Applications”,
  - 2) communication with participants regarding matters related to the conference and documentation of its course  
– on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) GDPR, as this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest in connection with the mission of the higher education and science system in the fields of education, scientific activity and shaping civic attitudes,
  - 3) fulfilment of legal obligations incumbent upon the Controller related to the proper settlement of the conference – pursuant to applicable legal regulations – Article 6(1)(c) GDPR,
  - 4) informational and promotional purposes – processing of participants’ personal data is carried out pursuant to Article 6(1)(e) GDPR and Article 6(1)(a) GDPR with regard to the recording and use of participants’ image.
4. Recipients of your personal data may include entities providing services to the University, including IT service providers, legal service providers, and other entities authorized under applicable law.
5. Your personal data will be stored for the period necessary for the proper organization of the conference and subsequently for the period required by applicable archiving regulations.
6. You have the right to access the content of your personal data and, subject to applicable legal provisions, the right to:
  - 1) withdraw consent (the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out before its withdrawal),
  - 2) rectify your personal data,
  - 3) erase your personal data,
  - 4) restrict the processing of personal data,
  - 5) object to the processing of personal data.
7. If you believe that the processing of your personal data violates applicable data protection laws, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority. In Poland, this authority is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (UODO).
8. Providing personal data is voluntary but necessary for registration and participation in the conference. Failure to provide personal data will make participation in the above-mentioned conference impossible.
9. Your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making or profiling referred to in Article 22 of the Regulation.
