

**Controller's Information – pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 (hereinafter: GDPR)**

1. The controller of your personal data is Białystok University of Technology, ul. Wiejska 45A, 15-351 Białystok, Poland, tel.: +48 85 746 90 00, <https://www.pb.edu.pl> (hereinafter: the University).
2. In accordance with Article 37(1)(a) of the GDPR, the Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer whom you may contact regarding matters related to the processing of personal data via email at: [iod@pb.edu.pl](mailto:iod@pb.edu.pl).
3. Your personal data will be processed for the following purposes:
  - 1) registration of participation and organization of the workshops,
  - 2) communication with participants regarding matters related to the organization of the workshops and documentation of their course,  
– on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR, as this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest in connection with the mission of the higher education and science system in the fields of education, scientific activity, and shaping civic attitudes,
  - 3) informational and promotional purposes – the processing of participants' personal data is carried out on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR and Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR with regard to the recording of image.
4. Recipients of your personal data may include entities providing services to the University, including IT service providers, legal service providers, and other entities authorized under applicable law. Recipients of the recorded image may include users of the controller's website and social media platforms on which the controller maintains accounts.
5. Your personal data will be stored for the period necessary for the proper organization of the workshops and subsequently for the period required by legal regulations concerning archiving.
6. You have the right to access the content of your personal data and, subject to the provisions of law, you have the right to:
  - 1) withdraw your consent, provided that the withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out on the basis of consent before its withdrawal;
  - 2) rectify your data,
  - 3) erase your data,
  - 4) restrict the processing of your data,
  - 5) object to the processing of your personal data.
7. If you believe that the processing of your personal data violates generally applicable legal provisions in this area, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority. In Poland, this authority is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (UODO).
8. Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary for registration and participation in the workshops. Failure to provide personal data will result in the inability to participate in the workshops.
9. Your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making or profiling referred to in Article 22 of the Regulation.
